"Continue to improve pedestrian and cycling infrastructure and pathways."

"Footpath upgrades in John St, Betula St, Ashburton St, Station St & Riley Rd."



"Strive to maintain attractive and diverse green spaces throughout the City to encourage outdoor activity, health and wellbeing." "Turf renovations were completed on all of the City's active playing surfaces. Sand insertion project to improve the surface drainage was carried out at Queens Park Reserve. East Cannington Park was improved with new play equipment, shade sails, a barbeque and picnic spot, drinking fountain, extension to irrigation program and a cricket pitch."



"Recommend and encourage sustainable building and land use."

"Solar Panels have been upgraded from 30 Kw to 100 Kw at the Civic and Administration Building, Cannington Leisureplex and Riverton Leisureplex. In excess of 360 tonnes of CO2 is likely to be saved per year and this will provide an increase in electricity generation in excess of 300,000kWh per year."



"Promote road safety for all road users by providing a safe, efficient and well maintained road network." "Approximately \$9.6 million was spent in 2015/16 and \$12.8M during 2014/15 on road improvement, road rehabilitation, road resurfacing, traffic management, footpath construction, street lighting and drainage improvements."
